Do you have blackspots in your house where you lose your internet connection? Are there places where you keep losing your Wi-Fi signal? It's a common problem for many households. There are some good wireless range extenders which can improve the Wi-Fi connection, but they can be unreliable and don't give full coverage for larger properties, especially houses with 2 or more levels.

The new solution is to create what's called a 'Mesh connection'. It consists of between one or more disks, which connect to your wireless router, but create a whole new network that can reach the most remote corners of your house, giving maximum signal strength in every room.

It's not cheap, with equipment starting from around £200, plus installation costs. However, it is the best solution to give full Wi-Fi coverage in every room of even the largest of properties, whether you live in a large flat or Downton Abbey!

Windows 11 is released in next few weeks.



The much-anticipated release of Microsoft's Windows Operating System, Windows 11, is due for release in October. I personally haven't seen it yet, so can't comment on it just yet, but there are many reviews online. Here's a particularly informative review which includes Microsoft's own promo video.

It will be made available free of charge for most compatible Windows 10 PCs, as part of the Windows Update service.

Should you upgrade straight away? The short answer is **probably not**. Many techy people I have spoken to say that it's best to wait for maybe 6 months, so Microsoft can fix any teething bugs, that usually occur after the launch of a new operating system. It's also possible that your PC may not have the required minimum hardware requirements. Windows 11 requires a good processor speed, at least 8Gb RAM memory and a large amount of free hard drive disk space.

I remember when Windows 10 was launched 6 years ago, and many older computers which had been running Windows 7 found that after upgrading to Windows 10, their computer dramatically slowed down and didn't run as well as it used to. I had to uninstall Windows 10 and revert back to Windows 7.

However, it may be absolutely fine and safe to install. I will of course install it in my own computer first, so I can understand the new changes.

Also, new PCs from October onwards, will come with Windows 11 pre-installed at the factory, so they will be absolutely fine.

Supercharge your old, slow computer into a super speedy PC.

Has your computer slowed down during lockdown? Is it taking much longer than it used to before it starts up in the morning, sometimes up to 5 minutes or more? Does it sometimes freeze up just at the wrong time when you're in the middle of something important?
